

Home-Schooling Tips for Parents

1) Children struggle to learn when they're stressed. Bear this in mind.

4) No matter what they say and unless told otherwise, try to stick to the school timetable. Kids like routine and a "business as usual" attitude from you will probably help reassure them.

5) Teenagers can be annoying. The best teachers I've ever worked with have impeccable poker faces. Smile at your kids a lot (not in a weird way obviously). Tell them they are doing a good job (even if they aren't) and that you are proud of the progress they are making; it makes a huge difference to them mentally and their willingness to learn.

6) Teenagers can be rude. You could be a particle physicist but at some point, in the next few weeks, a thirteen-year-old is probably going to tell you that you're an idiot because you don't know what scene Banquo's soliloquy is in. Don't take it personally.

7) Children's behaviour and attitude tends to closely reflect that of their parents.

8) Finally, you've got long enough; try to understand what makes your child tick. I learn something new from the children I teach every day. The chances are that you will as well.
