

- 19% of readers say that reading stops them from feeling lonely. This is backed up by a study analysing social connectedness which found that reading books significantly reduces feelings of loneliness for people aged 18-64.
- Participation in shared reading groups is linked to enhanced relaxation, calmness, concentration, quality of life, confidence and self-esteem, as well as feelings of shared community and common purpose.
- Higher literacy skills are associated with a range of positive societal benefits, including having a stronger sense of belonging to society and being more likely to trust others.
- Studies have found that reading for pleasure enhances empathy, understanding of the self, and the ability to understand one's own and others' identities. For example, reading Harry Potter has been shown to improve children's attitudes toward stigmatized groups such as immigrants, refugees, and members of the LGBT community.
- Children who read books often at age 10 and more than once a week at age 16 gain higher results in maths, vocabulary and spelling tests at age 16 than those who read less regularly.

The World Book Day £1 books are a gift from booksellers, who fully fund the cost of the £1 book token redemptions. Check with your local bookseller what plans they have in place for World Book Day. Please note:

- The £1 book token can be exchanged for one of our **exclusive**, **new £1 books** OR for getting £1 off any book or audiobook costing £2.99 or more in participating bookshops and supermarkets.
- The book token is valid from **Thursday 18 February Sunday 28 March 2021**. Participating booksellers will honour the tokens beyond the 28 March while stocks last. Please contact your local bookseller to check if they are able to offer £1 off other titles.
- The book token can be printed out and taken to your local bookseller. **Booksellers such as Sainsbury's and Asda are unable to accept the voucher on a phone or tablet screen.** For all other booksellers, please check before you visit.
- The book token can ONLY be used in participating bookshops (find your nearest at **booksellers.org.uk/wbd**)
- The digital £1 book token cannot be redeemed online.
- The digital £1 book token is intended for SINGLE-USE ONLY.

All major supermarkets including Asda, Tesco, Morrisons, Sainsbury's and most large bookshop chains including WH Smith, Waterstones and Eason and hundreds of independent booksellers are participating, as are a number of school book clubs – Scholastic and Usborne Books At Home.

Please check before making a journey that your local store is participating.

What World Book Day achieved in 2020:

- We gifted 1.03 million £1 books in the UK & Ireland in only five weeks,
- **3 in 10** of children receiving free school meals said the book they 'bought' with their WBD book token was the **first book** they had of their own,
- We encouraged at least 25,000,000 minutes of shared reading,
- We made an impact: 64% of early years settings and 66% primary schools said World Book Day changed reading habits.

Research found that **95.9% of children have heard of World Book Day** and **children who participate in World Book Day** activities are **more engaged in reading and books** than those who don't.
